

MUSIC CMMISSI¥NING SERIES



[OVERVIEW]

The Music Commissioning Series, a flagship project of the Foundation for The Arts and Social Enterprise, is proud to announce its inaugural composer, Dr Kelly Tang, a renowned Singaporean composer and recipient of the prestigious Cultural Medallion in 2011. Dr Tang's contributions to the local music scene have been instrumental in shaping the country's cultural identity, and his involvement in this project marks a significant milestone in our efforts to promote and celebrate Singapore's rich heritage.

Dr Tang's composition, a 40-minute suite for a full orchestra of approximately 70 musicians, draws inspiration from a curated selection of artworks from the National Gallery Singapore's collection. The Metropolitan Festival Orchestra premiered the suite at the Esplanade Concert Hall in 2023, promising an unforgettable musical experience for audiences.



"I'm honoured to be selected as the first composer for this Commissioning Series that is the first of its kind to showcase the best of Singapore composers, and promises to bring them onto the global stage, where their work will be performed to a global audience. This is a large-scale effort to promote Singapore work and art in a field that promises to realise the full potential of the creative talent that we possess".

- The Music Commissioning Series is a 10-year undertaking to establish a Canon of Singapore Music
- Commissioning major works by Singapore composers to create a lasting legacy
- Draws inspiration from the National Gallery Singapore's collection to promote and celebrate Singapore's rich cultural identity
- It will provide a platform for local musicians to showcase their skills, driving growth and development in the music industry
- The first commission fosters a deeper appreciation for classical music and its role in Singapore's cultural identity among music students and enthusiasts
- Premiering at the Esplanade Concert Hall in 2023, attracting international attention and promoting cultural exchange and collaboration

[Overview]

Mikkel Myer Lee is a gifted concert pianist who has performed at the Mozarteum in Salzburg and the Het Concertgebouw in Amsterdam and was invited to perform at the famed Carnegie Hall in New York in 2020 before the outbreak of COVID-19.


In 2022, the 9-year old Mikkel, accompanied by a 41-member orchestra, entranced a capacity audience with his effortless virtuosity to move from the drama of Beethoven's Concerto No. 3 to the poetry of Chopin's Concerto No. 2 at Singapore's Victoria Concert Hall.

The Foundation recognises Mikkel's exceptional talent and dedication and is committed to supporting his artistic journey towards becoming a world-class concert pianist. This collaboration provides Mikkel with access to mentorship, performance opportunities, and financial assistance, enabling him to develop his skills further and propel his career to new heights.

At The Foundation, we aim to remove financial barriers and nurture the innate aptitude of child prodigies like Mikkel as they journey towards world-class talent.









[Impact of the Film]

"SMOKE" has also received strong local support, with tickets to the Singapore International Film Festival (SGIFF) being snapped up within five minutes.

By participating in prestigious festivals and earning accolades, the director and his team have gained validation for their artistic endeavours and strengthened their professional standing. These achievements create opportunities for collaborations, funding, and expanded networks, propelling them towards their next creative endeavours. The recognition garnered through these short films serves as a stepping stone to larger-scale projects, where commercial viability becomes more attainable.

[Moving Forward]

Director Lee invested his personal funds, including prize money from a film competition and personal savings, in his passion for storytelling. Additionally, the actors graciously agreed to work for lower fees than usual, demonstrating their commitment to the project and belief in its potential.

Short films, unfortunately, often face challenges in securing funding due to their limited commercial prospects. Compared to longer forms of filmmaking, short films lack the avenues for product placements, box office

revenue, and other sponsorships that contribute to a funding pool. Nonetheless, these shorter works play a crucial role in a director's journey, allowing them to refine their craft and gain experience before venturing into commercially viable projects.

The production cycle for a short film typically spans one to one-and-a-half years, including the crucial stage of pitching the film to international festivals. Each festival submission incurs a fee, and with hundreds of festivals and competitions worldwide, the process can be both time-consuming and financially demanding. However, the potential rewards are immense. Accumulating accolades and recognition from these festivals enhances the director's, cast, and production personnel's prospects for future projects.

The Foundation will continue to support Alvin's efforts to promote "SMOKE" internationally to maximise its potential.



[TL;DR]

- "SMOKE GETS IN YOUR EYES" is a dark comedy directed by Alvin Lee. It explores the themes of family unity and empathy in the context of Singapore's fading tradition of HDB void deck funerals
- The film stars renowned actors Wang Weiliang, Priscelia Chan, and Oon Shu An
- "SMOKE" has gained international recognition, winning awards at the Golden Rooster Awards in China and being screened at prestigious film festivals such as the Clermont Film Festival in France and the Kaohsiung Film Festival in Taiwan
- Despite director Alvin Lee's initial reservations about the film's reception outside Southeast Asia, it has resonated with audiences worldwide, affirming the universal appeal of its themes and the power of storytelling to transcend cultural boundaries
- The production of "SMOKE" was made possible through a combination of grants, personal funds, and contributions from The Foundation's network of patrons. Short films face funding challenges due to limited commercial prospects, but they serve as stepping stones for directors to advance to larger-scale projects and gain wider industry recognition

Granny Battery

[OVERVIEW]

Granny Battery is a story about regret, awakening, and realising that it is never too late to start doing what you want. This action comedy, crafted by writer/director Koh Zhi Hao and producer Goh Koonhow, follows the journey of three senior citizens who embark on a daring adventure to break free from the confines of their nursing home and attend a rock concert.

The film begins with the sudden passing of a dear friend, which catalyses the three main characters to re-evaluate their lives. As they reflect on their past choices and missed opportunities, they realise there is always time to pursue their dreams. The trio, each with their own unique personality and backstory, decide to take a bold step and escape the nursing home to attend a rock concert featuring their favourite band.

As they navigate the challenges of their daring escape, they encounter a series of comedic misadventures, from dodging the watchful eyes of the nursing home staff to overcoming the physical limitations of their age. Through their journey, the film explores the themes of friendship, self-discovery, and the importance of living life to the fullest.






Festival Winds 2022

[Overview]

'Festival Winds' is organised by the Band Directors' Association (Singapore) and returned for its fourth year, running from 20 to 22 December and on 24 December. The Foundation is a proud supporter of this meaningful outreach event, aimed at fostering opportunities for students to experience and grow in the field of symphonic band music.

Festival Winds is a premier musical experience for students (10- to 20-year-olds) throughout Singapore to perform together. In 2022, the organisers expanded the student participants' age group to include upper primary school students. Accepted students participated in masterclasses with an esteemed professional faculty and rehearsed as an ensemble for three days. At the end of the festival, students put on a full-length concert to demonstrate their growth and development at the Esplanade Concert Hall.

Beethoven Im Garten

[OVERVIEW]

Following a hiatus due to COVID, Beethoven im Garten returned to the Singapore Botanic Gardens with new partnerships: the Foundation of the Arts and Social Enterprise as the organiser, and the Dresden Philharmonic and the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music, and the Singapore Botanic Gardens, as programme and venue partners, respectively.

Beethoven im Garten 2022 is the third in a series of concerts held at the Singapore Botanic Gardens to celebrate Singaporean-German friendship. The series was inaugurated in 2018 in association with Singaporean conductor Kahchun Wong, the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music (YSTCM), and the Nuremberg Symphony Orchestra. It builds on the achievements of Wong, who is an alumnus of music academies in Singapore and Germany, the prize winner of the 2016 Gustav Mahler Competition, and the Chief Conductor of the Nuremberg Symphony Orchestra since 2018.

[TL;DR]

The Foundation's partnership with the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in Singapore began in 2020 with the inaugural Beethoven im Garten Beethoven im Garten 2022 returned to the Singapore Botanic Gardens in March 2022, following a hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic

Conducted by Kahchun Wong, 10 musicians from the Dresden Philharmonic and its affiliate, the Kurt Masur Academy, joined 35 musicians from the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory Orchestra, to perform Beethoven's 4th Symphony.

Singapore Clay Festival 2022

[OVERVIEW]

The Singapore Clay Festival 2022 showcased the exceptional craftsmanship of 128 local clay artists at The Clay Makers' Market. This national event serves as a dynamic platform for clay practitioners, significantly enriching the visual arts scene. It breaks down barriers, enabling clay artists to extend beyond their studio spaces and engage with a broader audience.

Ceramists included master potters such as Ahmad Abu Bakar and Jessie Lim, as well as potters from leading Singapore studios like Goh Eck Kheng, Mona Malhotra, Rachita Tania Misra, Saya Yamaguchi, Suriani Suratman, Sunar Sugiyou, Toh Kiam Hock, and Yulianti Tan, alongside many newer pottery enthusiasts. The Foundation collaborated with the Singapore Clay Festival, which took place from 10-13 November 2022 at Enabling Village, and has been a dedicated partner since the inaugural Singapore Clay Festival in 2021, amplifying recognition of this artistic craft and fine arts.
